KEY STATISTICS ON WOMEN'S POLITICAL LEADERSHIP



Women have the right to influence decisions that affect their lives but are drastically under-represented in leadership at all levels of society.

#### GLOBAL SNAPSHOT

## 1 in 20

of the world's mayors and

councillors are women. (Estimate - UCLG, 2018)

#### 23.8%

is the current worldwide average of women's participation in national parliaments. (IPU, 2018)

## 20 women

hold the office of Head of State or Head of Government, representing just 6.3% of the total number of international leaders. (Women In International Politics, 2018)



The percentage of women in **Pacific parliaments is 7.5% (2018),** the lowest in the world.

Women's representation is also below the **global average in Southeast Asia, at 19.41%. (2018)**

When women lead, everybody benefits and communities are safer and more EQUAL. A survey conducted by the Inter-Parliamentary Union of 187 female parliamentarians from 65 countries revealed that 89% of these women believed they had a special responsibility to represent the interests and needs of women. (IPU, 2008)

Cross-country analysis found that when at least one quarter of members of parliament are women, laws that discriminate against women are more likely to be repealed. (Cited in World Bank, 2014)

When women are included in a peace process, the resulting agreement is 35% more likely to last longer than 15 years. (UN Women, 2015)



#### **Papua New Guinea**

0.5% or 35 out of 6138 local level government representatives are women.

#### Timor Leste

4.75% of community (suco) chiefs are women in Timor-Leste (2017).

# Solomon Islands

2.3% or 4 out of 172 members of Provincial Assemblies across 9 Provinces are women (2018).



## Cambodia

16.76% of commune council seats are held by women (as at 2017 commune council election).

## Myanmar

0.25% or 42 out of 16,785 village tract or ward administrators are women (2015).

## **Bougainville**

2 women were elected as Chairperson and 41 as Vice-Chairperson, out of 43 rural Community Governments (2017).
