POSITION SUMMARY

The Individual Deprivation Measure (IDM) Program is a research partnership between Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT), Australian National University (ANU) and IWDA, aimed at changing the way global poverty is measured in order to be more inclusive, gender-sensitive, and to reveal inequality. This includes collection of data in developing countries (Nepal and Fiji to date, and another three countries before 2020), and with



marginalised populations within these countries. The IDM research program is organised around four pillars, Data, Measure, Technology and Communications.

Reporting to the IDM Research Fellow, the Research Officer will work across four pillars of the IDM research program, focussing primarily on the research-related pillars of 'Data' and 'Measure'. The role will be responsible for performing core initial analysis of IDM survey data to generate dimension scores and create a composite index from these dimensions. The Research Officer will also analyse differences in poverty and inequality by factors such as gender, age, ability, socio-economic background. The Research Officer will generate tables and charts to communicate results, and document work and issues to facilitate a consistent approach across IWDA and ANU and enable comparative analysis of data across countries.
